Slim has a friend who will provide sweatshirts of t-shirts that say "Town of Groton" on them for anyone who participates in the cleanup scheduled for Saturday, May 4^{th} at 10:00 – noon with lunch to follow at the townhouse.

Slim Spafford received a letter from the Nature Conservancy that announced the Kimball Hill property was purchased and sold to New Hampshire Fish and Game. The Nature Conservancy will retain the conservation easement. The landlocked

Merrill lot which contains 100 acres adjacent to the Kimball Hill Property has also been purchased by Fish and Game.

Slim reported that he has received the Natural Resources Inventory (NRI) and is currently reading through it. He will bring it to the next meeting for review.

Ruth discussed several workshops offered by NH Extension Service and NHACC Slim will attend the "Easement Monitoring for Volunteers" workshop on April 26th in Canterbury. Ruth will sign him up.

Slim and Gina will attend the "How to Lead a Nature Walk" program on Friday, June 28th at Squam Lakes Nature Center. Ruth will sign Slim up.

There is also a grant application for a local Bioblitz which Ruth will explore to see if Groton is eligible.
