Lunch was served at the Town House following the Clean Up and all agreed it had been a successful effort and a great community builder. Everyone appreciated the T shirts handed out by a generous donor who wishes to remain anonymous.

Slim attended the conservation Easement Monitoring Program in Canterbury. Conservation Commissions throughout New Hampshire are responsible for seeing these lands are monitored. It was agreed that the next meeting would be devoted to a discussion of which lands in Groton are required to be monitored. It was further agreed that a letter would be sent to each of these properties asking

who is currently monitoring these properties and how often. The commission will work on this at their next meeting.
